

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Minutes of the PANYC General Membership Meeting 25 September 1996

President Joseph Schuldenrein called the meeting to order at 6:41 P.M. The following committees will report: Action, Parks, Archives, Events, Exhibit, Membership, Metropolitan Chapter NYSA, Newsletter, Public Program, Research and Planning.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The minutes of the last meeting were accepted with the following corrections: Under ARCHIVES the sentence beginning, Stone suggested that future Newsletters... should be deleted. Under EVENTS, Stone reported the success should be Dallal reported. Under EXHIBIT, she met should be the committee met and until October should read through September. The word quality should also be deleted. The sentence beginning, Pagano suggested... should be deleted and replaced with the committee is in the process of writing the proposal for the NYFA. Under MET CHAPTER, Cohen should be Cohn. Under RESEARCH AND PLANNING, the committee should include Freeman.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Stone reported a balance of \$1,217.43 in the PANYC checking account. The Secretary agreed to mail reminders to members who have not yet paid their dues. Stone reported that she filed her first PANYC tax return with the help of Harris. Geismar will ask vendors to supply PANYC with a Blanket Sales Tax Resale Certificate to verify that taxes are being collected with the sale of PANYC merchandise.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Schuldenrein reinstated the Parks Committee with Geismar as chairperson. Other members are Wall, Rakos and Schuldenrein. Geismar reported that she met with Scott Heyl of the Historic House Trust of New York City. Mr. Heyl is seeking input as to how he should approach the problems in Parks. Geismar sent Heyl a copy of a 1985 letter from PANYC to Parks Commissioner Stern, chastising Stern's handling of the Van Cortlandt Mansion. Geismar requested permission to send Heyl a copy of the "NYC Parks and Recreation Properties, Borough of Brooklyn, Preliminary Archaeology Assessments" report prepared by PANYC, to serve as a guideline. The membership agreed, with the stipulation that it be made clear to Heyl that these guidelines are not to be considered a "be all and end all" and with a reminder that the report is not up to date.

Schuldenrein reported that he received a copy of the 106 Regulations and would like comments. He organized a committee consisting of himself, Harris and Geismar. Klein remarked that Tom King had been writing comments about the Regulations and feared that these comments would be paraphrased and used in place of the

ARCHIVES: Geismar reported that Dallal had arranged for the South Street Seaport Library to store the PANYC Archives. Geismar will contact Library Director, Norman Brouwer to finalize the details.

EVENTS: Stone reported that upcoming events would be listed in the Newsletter. The next NYSAA Met Chapter meeting, (October 12th; rain date Oct. 19th), will consist of a walking tour of Inwood Park led by Mike Cohn and will be co-hosted by the South St. Seaport Museum.

EXHIBIT: Stone reported that the sponsorship application to the NYFA was rejected. Additional funding is needed for the exhibit. Appeals for donations will be made to such "archaeology-friendly-suppliers" as Marshalltown and others. CRM firms will also be approached for donations. Schuldenrein will examine the feasibility of producing a brochure, "in-house." Names of donors will be listed in the brochure. The Executive Board asked the General Membership for \$250 from the Treasury and the Membership voted favorably upon the request. Stone will write a letter to the Membership requesting donations. The request will be sent out with the minutes in the next mailing. Kileen offered to see if John Hotopp of LBA would be willing to produce some of the photography.

MEMBERSHIP: PANYC welcomed Kate Morgan to its membership.

NEWSLETTER: The PANYC Newsletter will be mailed. All project abstracts, etc. should be sent to Fitts' new address which is printed on the latest Newsletter.

MET CHAPTER: See EVENTS.

PUBLIC PROGRAM: Harris reported that she received a call from Jane McNamara of the MCNY regarding the possibility of a "tie-in" between the Public Program, which is scheduled for Sunday, April 13th, and the PANYC exhibit. Harris agreed to provide a title by October 1st.

RESEARCH AND PLANNING: Harris will schedule a meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Schuldenrein will present a talk at the next meeting which has been scheduled for December 4th, 1996.

No further business was brought before the membership.

# PROFESSIONAL ARCHAEOLOGISTS OF NEW YORK CITY

Dear Fellow PANYC Members and Newsletter Subscribers,

For almost two years now, you have been reading about our proposal for an exhibit in the Community Gallery at the Museum of the City of New York. If you have been to our meetings, you have been in on the decision making process regarding the exhibit. Now it looks like our exhibit will be a reality. MCNY has advertised us in their new brochure - *We Dig New York: The Professional Archaeologists of New York City* opening April 2, 1997.

Unfortunately, since our proposal was originally made, the museum has lost its funding for the Community Gallery. This has put us in a financial bind. However, because we have numerous in-kind contributions, our burden to raise cash is not as great as it could have been. We need to raise only about \$1000. The executive board has recommended, and membership unanimously voted, to provide the exhibit with \$250, 1/4 of the PANYC treasury. We are also soliciting donations from contractors, suppliers, individuals and agencies which may support our cause. However times are difficult for everyone. Therefore we are appealing to you for donations to help fund the exhibit. Thankfully, the Museum of the City of New York has agreed to accept donations on behalf of the exhibit, making your contribution tax deductible. You could contribute as little as \$10. If each of you made such a contribution, we would be nearer to meeting our goal. Of course, we would be more than happy to accept larger contributions of \$50 or \$100, or whatever your wallet allows. Should we raise above our \$1000 minimum, the extra funds will go to improving the quality of the exhibit by presenting higher quality photographs and producing a multi-color or multi-page brochure rather than a flier and perhaps even funding a reception. If you are unable to contribute financially, but could make a donation of services or know of anyone who would be willing to do so, please let any of our committee members know. All contributors, either financial or in-kind will be acknowledged in the exhibit and the brochure/flier.

We sincerely appreciate your consideration in this matter and hope you are able to contribute. Checks should be made out to the Museum of the City of New York, with "We Dig New York" written in the memo area, and sent to Kathy Benson/Museum of the City of New York/1220 Fifth Ave./New York, NY 10029, preferably by the end of the year.

#### Landscape, Land Use, and the Iconography of Space in the Hudson River Valley: Prehistory to the Present.

The Hudson River is seen today as a recently spoiled natural environment. However, research shows that the riverine landscape has been extensively modified by human activity since before the industrial revolution. This paper will consider both the physical changes in the Hudson River landscape and associated iconographic representations, as these were influenced by cultural and historical processes. Selecting specific locations along the river, the authors examine and analyze local histories of land use with special emphasis on subsistence modes; extractive technologies; trade, commerce and transport; and industrial production. Evidence includes maps, photographs, paintings and engravings, texts, archaeological remains, and the built environment.

This panel is in association with the NYAS Hudson River Series.

# PROFESSIONAL ARCHAEOLOGISTS OF NEW YORK CITY

## MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

Membership in PANYC is open to any professional archaeologist who subscribes to the purpose of the organization and who meets the following criteria:

- a. Applicants must have been awarded an advanced degree (M.A., M.S., M.Phil., Ph.D., D.Sc., or official A.B.D.) from an accredited institution in archaeology, anthropology, history, classical studies or other germane discipline with a specialization in archaeology.
- b. Applicants must have at least six weeks of professionally supervised archaeological field training and four weeks of supervised laboratory analysis and/or curation experience. Requirements for both field and laboratory experience will be considered to have been met by attendance at an archaeological field school which meets the guidelines set by the Society of Professional Archaeologists (SOPA).
- c. Applicants must demonstrate professional experience in one or more areas of archaeological activity, such as: field research and excavation, research on archaeological collections, archival research, administration of units within public or private agencies oriented toward archaeological research, conduct of cultural resource management studies for public agencies, or teaching with an emphasis on archaeological topics. Applicants meeting the education and training criteria and having other professional interests related to archaeology will be considered on a case by case basis.
- d. All prospective applicants must be approved by a majority of members present at a regularly scheduled meeting of the general membership.
- e. Applicants should submit a statement of purpose that includes their interest in New York City archaeology. Members of PANYC have a commitment to protect and preserve the city's archaeological resources and to support research and encourage publication of information recovered from those resources. Members will not engage in illegal or unethical conduct involving archaeological matters. In applying for membership it is expected that an individual is in agreement with these goals. PANYC is not an accrediting organization and is not to be used as such.

Application for membership shall be in writing and shall include a copy of the applicant's resume or *vita*.

We invite anyone interested in New York City archaeology to subscribe to our Newsletter and to attend our general membership meetings and annual Public Symposium.
